Alba Quaresimo of Bloomfield passed away peacefully in her home on Saturday, March 18, 2017. She was 91 years old.

For years, Alba along with her mother and sisters (Genevieve Petruccione, Tullia Ferrucci, Rosina Elefante, Letizia Frusciano, and Ernesta Porcelli) would prepare the weekly lunch specials for her brother, Alex, who would serve them at his tavern, the "322 Club" in Newark, NJ.

In 1956, she married the love of her life, Alphonse "Doc Al" Quaresimo. Alba was president of the Woman's UNICO Auxiliary. Both she and Al were charter members of Bloomfield's UNICO, and for many years they chaired its scholarship fund. She also belonged to an Italian dance club that did authentic dances of Italy, and she was member of the September Club at St. Thomas the Apostle Church.
