Old St. Mary's exists to proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord, Savior, and God. As we grow in holiness by being His disciples, we invite all to give themselves totally to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. With Mary, our Mother and the Patroness of Old St. Mary's, we join our voices with those of many generations in praying: "We are the servants of the Lord. Let it be done to us according to God's word" (see Luke 1:38).

St. Mary's is on the National Register of Historic Places and is the oldest standing house of worship in the city of Cincinnati. Many German immigrants settled in this area, and to this day this neighborhood is called "Over-the-Rhine." Here, in 1841-42, the German Catholics of Cincinnati built St. Mary's Church, reportedly using bricks baked in their own kitchen ovens.



ASCENSION OF OUR LORD

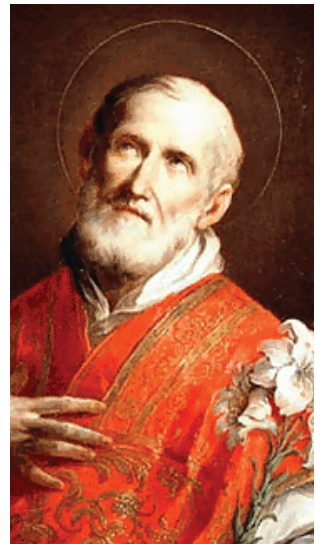

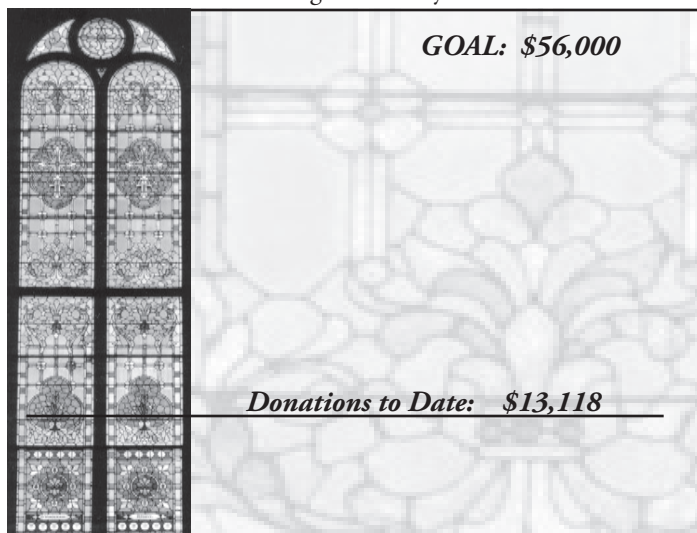

Old St. Mary's exists to proclaim that Jesus Christ is Lord, Savior, and God. As we grow in holiness by being His disciples, we invite all to give themselves totally to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. With Mary, our Mother and the Patroness of Old St. Mary's, we join our voices with those of many generations in praying: "We are the servants of the Lord. St. Mary's is on the National Register of Historic Places and is the oldest standing house of worship in the city of Cincinnati. Many German immigrants settled in this area, and to this day this neighborhood is called "Over-the-Rhine." Here, in 1841-42, the German Catholics of Cincinnati built St. Mary's Church, reportedly using bricks baked in their own kitchen ovens.

In this way they preserved the memory of the great churches of Germany, with their elaborate stained glass windows and massive pipe organs. The parish continues to preserve the rich liturgical, musical and cultural heritage of Catholic tradition. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered in Latin, German, and English. St. Mary's is known for its splendid music (chant), its Marian statues, and its privileged high altar. St. Mary's is supported by the prayers and sacrifices of its people. You can help Old St. Mary's preserve the riches of the past and minister to the needs of the present by adding your support.



Solemnity of the Sacred Heart

Pope Benedict XVI has declared that June 19, the Feast of the Sacred Heart, is the beginning of the Year for Priests.

For both priests and laypeople there is an opportunity to gain a plenary indulgence.

To gain the indulgence, priests must pray vespers before the exposed Blessed Sacrament, and laypeople must attend Holy Mass and offer prayers to Jesus Christ for His priests, or perform any good work to sanctify and mould themselves to His

Sacred Heart. Both priests and people must go to confession and pray for the intentions of the Pope. The opportunity to gain this indulgence is available on the opening and closing days of the Year for Priests, on the 150th anniversary of the death of St. John Vianney (August 4), and on the first Thursday of every month.

The parish continues to preserve the rich liturgical, musical and cultural heritage of Catholic tradition. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered in Latin, German, and English. St. Mary's is known for its splendid music (chant), its Marian statues, and its privileged high altar. St. Mary's is supported by the prayers and sacrifices of its people.
